

While it has been a long while between newsletters, I'm pleased to report that St Francis' Choir is enjoying its return to singing after two years of limited activity due to the pandemic. Apart from the very well attended ceremonies of Holy Week and Easter, we have also had joyous celebrations of Pentecost and Corpus Christi with Masses featuring solo organ parts (the Mozart *Organ Solo Mass*, K. 259 and Haydn's *Great Organ Mass*). The organ parts were played with flair by our own Anthony Halliday with choir and soloists accompanied as usual by the Symphonia of Melbourne.

While we have much to look forward to, it is also important to pause and remember the important contributions made by two long-term choir personalities.



In late April, former chorister Walter Remmen died after a short illness. Walter will be remembered as a passionate man, whose boundless enthusiasm would not take 'no' for an answer. With extraordinary vision, Walter was the driving force behind the choir's two overseas tours, using his contacts in Germany and other parts of Europe to realise what at first seemed like an impossible dream. The resulting tours were wonderful experiences for all those who took part, and they did much to cement the choir's reputation both in Australia and overseas. To Walter's wife Brigitte and family we extend our deepest sympathy.



While not a singer, Martin Brown made a hugely important contribution to St Francis' Choir by becoming choir treasurer and also treasurer of the St Francis' Choir Foundation. Through his prudent stewardship, Martin ensured that the future finances of both choir and foundation were established on the firmest of foundations. Martin's friendliness and gentle humour will be missed. Martin's wife Marilyn sang in the choir and served as music secretary for many years. To her and the Brown family we also send our deepest sympathy.

Spotlight on Ben Glover

St Francis' Choir has recently celebrated the solemnity of Corpus Christi with an uplifting performance of Haydn's *Great Organ Mass* with vocal soloists and the Symphonia of Melbourne. This year the feast day has an additional significance for tenor choral scholar Ben Glover – it marks the tenth anniversary of his first performance with the choir.

The intervening decade has been a richly rewarding one for Ben. After undergraduate



studies at Monash University, Ben then moved to Melbourne University where he graduated with a Master of Music (Opera Performance) in 2021. Student performances in operas such as Britten's *Albert Herring*, Offenbach's *Orpheus in the Underworld* and Puccini's *Gianni Schicchi* have not only been vehicles for his fine, clear voice but have revealed a hidden talent for comic roles, something not obvious when Ben sings at Mass!

Singing with St Francis' Choir has nurtured Ben's interest in and love of sacred music, especially those works performed with orchestra. Therefore, in the last few years

Ben has enjoyed exploring the solo oratorio repertoire. This has been a fruitful exploration, for in August 2022 Ben competed in the Royal Melbourne Philharmonic Aria Competition, winning the Conductor's Encouragement Award. This past April saw Ben performing as soloist with the RMP in a stirring performance of Mozart's Requiem in St Paul's Cathedral and he will



perform the work again with



the Geelong Chorale in August.

Other recent performances have included Saint-Saëns' *Christmas Oratorio* with the Victoria Chorale and the Art of Sound Orchestra and the *Mass in G minor* by Ralph Vaughan Williams with the

Geelong Chorale conducted by former St Francis' chorister Allister Cox OAM.
